The GST council has established a group of ministers to scrutinize the GST on health insurance policies. Currently premiums for both health and life insurance are subject to an 18% tax. This initiative was announced during the 54th council meeting, chaired by Union Finance Minister, Nirmala Sitharaman in New Delhi.

This comes after reports that the council was likely to offer substantial relief to individuals and senior citizens by reducing the GST rate on health insurance premiums. In the year 2023-24, the centre and states collected ₹ 8,262.94 crore GST from health insurance premiums - The 54th GST council meet began on Monday at Sushma Swaraj Bhawan in New Delhi.

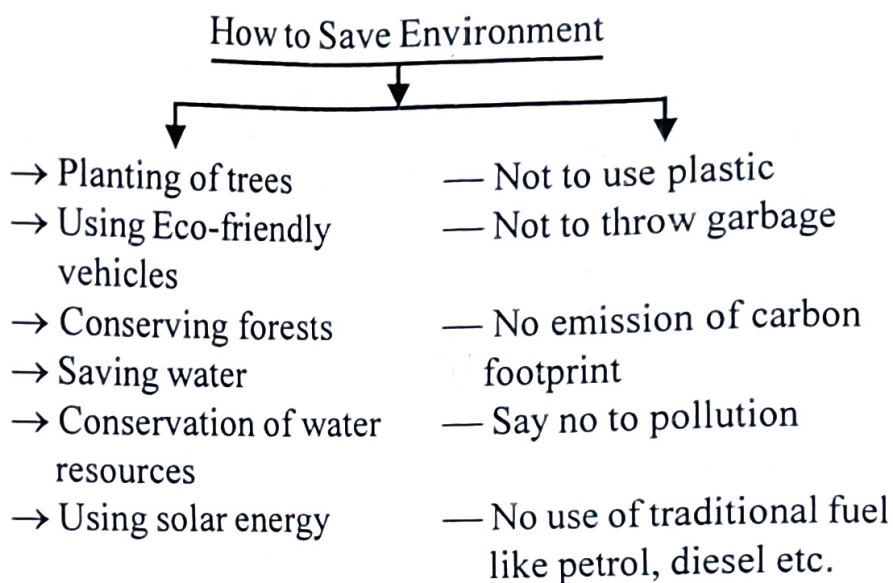
