- I. Alkali/caustic potash, caustic soda
- II. Animal/vegetable fat/mahua/coconut or any other oil
- III. Sodium/potassium salts of fatty acids
- IV. Starch
- V. Acid slurry (any two)

Working of detergent:

- I. Head-Hydrophilic tail-hydrophobic form micelles
- II. Break surface tension of water- water becomes fluid
- III. Detergents reach between dirt and clothes
- IV. Scrubbing breaks dirt
- V. Detergent molecules Surround dirt floats on top
- VI. Dirt is carried by tail

Rules of strain removal:

- I. Test the chemical in hidden corner of the fabric
- II. Choose correct chemicals
- III. Do not use concentrated chemical solutions for delicate fabrics
- IV. Work in a circular movement starting from outer towards centre.
- V. Do not use one strong application of chemical
- VI. Use several weak applications
- VII. Neutralize acid reagents with an alkaline rinse and all reagents with acidic rinse.
- VIII. Rinse all traces of chemicals immediately after removing the strain. (any four)
