Question 2

1. We need to eat healthy in order to stay healthy. Let's start by walking to the nearest grocery or vegetable market for shopping in the old way, rather than stepping out of the

house and getting into the car. Grocery shopping will be an easier experience and you will bring home healthier foods if you start with a healthy grocery shopping list. With a grocery list in-hand, you won't wonder what to buy!

2. Fresh vegetables and fruits should make up the largest part of your healthy shopping. Vegetables and fruits have vitamins, minerals, anti-oxidants, and they are usually low in calories. Choose a variety of fruits and vegetables that everyone in your family will enjoy. Among fresh vegetables, go for lettuce, cucumbers, carrots, tomatoes, onions, peas, potatoes, and cauliflower, to name a few. Include fruits like bananas, apples, oranges, pomegranates, pears, etc.

3. Most of your grain and cereal products should be made from whole grains and not from refined flours. This part of your list includes whole grain breads, pastas, and breakfast cereals. Whole grains are important for vitamins, minerals, and fibre, which is often lacking in modern diets.

4. Protein and meat choices should consist mostly of fish, poultry and lean meats. Eggs, nuts, seeds and legumes are also good protein choices. Choose fresh food over frozen food. Beverages should be kept simple. Water, low fat milk, juices, and herbal teas are all good choices. If you opt for soft drinks, choose diet sodas and diet soft drinks to avoid extra sugar. Dairy products should include yogurt, cheese, and low-fat milk. Probiotic curd and yogurt are a great new option for a healthy meal.

Olive oil is the only vegetable oil that can be consumed as it is – with salad and as a dip with breads. Evils of Child Labour

Child labour is a business term which means to employ children at work below the age that has been demarcated by the government. "The child is the father of man." This famous line quoted by William Wordsworth refers to the importance of the child for the development of society as well as for the all-round development of the human race. We should never ignore the fact that the child is the purest form of God. His innocence brings us closer to the almighty. Child labourers are exploited, exposed to hazardous work conditions and paid a pittance for their long hours of work. They belong to the unorganized labour force.

Our government has laid down various guidelines to eradicate and finish the custom of child labour from the grass root level.

a. No child below the age of 14 years shall be employed to work in any hazardous employment

b. Childhood and youth are to be protected against exploitation and against moral and material abandonment.

c. The State shall endeavour to provide within a period of 10 years from the commencement of the Constitution free and compulsory education for all children until they have completed the age of 14 years.

Due to poverty, poor parents put their children to work in order to supplement the family's economic status. This compulsion forces the parents to forget that every child has his right to enjoy his childhood. There are more than 250million child labourers in our country.

Question 10

Solution



When the snake came to drink water from the water trough, the poet faced a conflict whether he should kill the snake or not. According to his education, he thought he should kill the snake since his education affirmed that in Sicily the gold snakes were venomous in nature. His human instinct was also to kill the snake initially since otherwise he would be considered weaker than the snake. Nonetheless, there was a part of the poet's conscience that told him not to inflict any pain and let the snake leave peacefully. This dilemma continued for a while but in the end, the poet gave in to kill the snake. So, suddenly he picks up a log and throws it at the remaining visible part of the snake while it is entering a hole. The snake gets stunned for a moment and then quickly moves into the hole. Solution

Anne had wanted to keep a diary because she wanted to confide everything in it as she had never been able to confide in anyone. She hoped that the diary, which she named Kitty, would be a great source of comfort to her and the diary did turn out to be a great source of comfort to Anne. She wrote regularly in it, she loved writing in the diary and it provided a sense of comfort to her when she put down her thoughts, experiences, and feelings. Anne had kept the diary from June 12, 1942 to August 1, 1944, initially she used to write for herself. Anne's overpowering loneliness makes her realize that one could be lonely even when surrounded by the people they loved. She felt distanced from the rest of her family and unable to communicate even though they were supportive and caring. She developed an intense and compelling need for solitary existence which stemmed from the fact that being in company brought on paradoxical loneliness. This sense of alienation manifested itself because people were too caught up in their own troubles to be responsive towards others. Peter was a departure from that acute loneliness she suffered, his company was conducive to her temperament and they both ended up confiding in each other. Her diary, Kitty, was like a friend to her, one to whom she could unburden the most intimate thoughts of her heart without being censured. The writings are in the mode of frank and intimate conversations with a dear friend. The diary was like Anne's secret confidante with whom she not only shared the daily occurrences of her life but also her innermost thoughts and feelings.

OR

Alfred Dussel was chosen from a circle of acquaintances as a single person who could blend in well with the extended family in hiding. He was a dentist who lived with a Christian lady quite a bit younger than he was but they were probably not married. He was known to be quiet, refined and seemed from their acquaintance to be nice. He was assigned to share Anne's room. Dussel was inquisitive by nature, asking all sorts of questions upon his arrival because he had been astonished by the ingenuity of their plan of going into hiding in plain view at the office. He was slow to catch on, asking everything twice and not remembering what had been told before. But very soon he revealed his true nature, he was a petty man who was a tattletale, always complaining of something, found Anne irksome, he would hoard food and be generally selfish and sullen. In order to kill the long hours of confinement, Dussel opened his dental practice in the annex, treating Mrs. Van Daan with a nonchalance required of his profession. He was quite lax with observing the rules of the house, he was a man used to set down rules in his own house and he missed his partner Charlotte all the time.

OR

Helen had written a little story called 'The Frost King' which she had sent to Mr. Anagnos of the Perkins Institution for the Blind. The latter was delighted with it and published the story in one of the institutional reports. However, it was discovered that a



story similar to her 'The Frost King' called 'The Frost Fairies' by Miss. Margaret T. Canby had appeared before Helen was born in a book called 'Birdie and His Friends.' The two stories were so much alike in thought and language that it was evident Miss Canby's story had been read to Helen and that her story was a case of plagiarism. A court of the investigation was constituted which consisted of eight people, four blind, four people with vision and votes were cast to arrive at a decision. Mr. Anagnos who had supported Helen initially changed tack and cast his vote against her. The incident scarred Helen in such a way that for a very long time she could not produce any creative work after this episode. She became excessively scrupulous about everything she wrote and the thought tormented her that what she wrote was not her original work. Miss Sullivan had to console her and allay her fears to in every which way possible in order to restore the confidence that Helen had lost. Eventually, Helen resumed her writing, urged on by her teacher.

OR

Helen was an ambitious woman. Helen was restless and too full of energy rather than motivated. People were attracted towards Helen by her eager, self-asserting disposition as a child before the illness struck. She was a sprightly and precocious child before the illness struck her. Helen was a person who engaged in tireless activity, she was never still for a moment and that was quite an impressive feat. She was here, there and everywhere. Her hands were in everything but nothing could hold her attention for too long as is evident from her varied interests ranging from reading to chess to sailing. Her restless spirit could not be satiated and it incessantly thirsted for things to do. Helen used to play pranks on everyone and seemed to be hungry for attention. She achieved everything with sheer diligence and she yearns to learn more. As a child she was ever inquisitive, the lessons never tired her and she was always open to learning. When Ms. Sullivan expressed her affection for her, she asked the meaning of love. Her curiosity did not die and after long she understood the meaning of love when she felt it. Similarly, the readers see her curiosity in her wish to touch the diamond cutting machines at the cape of good hope, and she wishes to feel the strokes of the paintbrush on her fingertips at the museum.
