Rain on the Roof

Introduction

This poem has been written by Coates Kinney, an American poet. The poem, as prescribed in syllabus, is not complete. Only the first three stanzas are given whereas the original poem contains six stanzas. It describes the poet's feelings and memories when the rain falls.

Summary

The poet says that when dark clouds covers the starry sky at night and it starts to rain then there is nothing better to lie in bed and listen to the patter of the rain falling on the cottage's rooftop. The poet says that each drop of rain that falls is accompanied by his heartbeat and a thousand memories flood his mind. These memories are entwined with each other as the poet continues to listen to the sound of raindrops. Slowly, the poet says, that his memories clear and he can see his mother as she used to come to tuck in his brothers, sisters and himself when they were small. The poet says that even as they slept, she used to gaze on them lovingly, aware that she would now see them only in the morning. The poet says that he could feel her loving gaze on him as the rain continues to fall.

Message

The poet wants to convey the message that it is the simple things in life that matter the most. Our memories are triggered not by materialistic things but by natural elements.

She used to come and tuck in the poet and his siblings when they were small. The poet says that even after they slept, their mother used to gaze lovingly at them. The poet feels her fond look on him as he listens to the music of the rain falling on the roof top. Thus, in this poem the poet shows love for his mother when it rains.
