

# Characteristics of a Successful Entrepreneur

### Fastrack Revision

- ▶ Entrepreneur: An entrepreneur is one who establishes one's own business with the intention of making profit, is action-oriented, willing to take risks and is highly motivated, innovative, raises money, provides capital and sets up an organisation/business.
- ► Key Elements of Entrepreneurs: There are four key elements of entrepreneurs:
  - > Vision: To identify new emerging opportunities.
  - Innovation: Creating new ways of doing something or establishing a new business.
  - > Risk-bearing: Taking risk and facing uncertainty.

- ▶ Entrepreneurship is a dynamic activity that helps the entrepreneur to bring changes and innovation in the process of production. Entrepreneurship comes from a French word 'Entreprendre', which means individuals who are 'undertakers', i.e., those who take the risk of a new enterprise.



- ▶ Entrepreneurship and Society: Entrepreneurs are the drivers of society. They contribute to things such as national employment, innovation, society building, community rejuvenation, economic development, etc. They provide opportunities that create social benefits for a community. They contribute to the welfare of society.
- ► How does an Entrepreneur help the Society: An entrepreneur helps the society in the following ways:
  - Donations: Businessmen donate a lot of money to charity, which is used for the welfare of the downtrodden and poor people and helps them in improving their living conditions.
  - Charitable Institutions: Various educational, medical and vocational training institutions are set-up by business persons to provide the less-privileged with benefits which they normally cannot afford.

- Sponsorship: Some business persons also sponsor candidates for higher education or fund children in an orphanage. In fact, many orphanages, home for the destitute, are backed by these business people.
- Welfare Programmes: Business persons financially contribute to many welfare programmes, like helping the blind, orphans, widows, organising donation camps, etc.
- ▶ Qualities of an Entrepreneur: The following are some qualities of an entrepreneur:
  - Discipline: Prosperous entrepreneurs will always focus their energy on making the business work. They will put in their best efforts to eliminate all obstacles which hinder the path of success.
  - Confidence: Successful entrepreneurs are confident enough about their potential and capabilities. They do not have doubts about their success.
  - Open Mindedness: A successful entrepreneur understands the importance of opportunities and knows how to encash them. They are efficient and full of ideas.
  - Initiation: Every successful entrepreneur is an initiator. They know if something has to be done, it has to be. They make the plan and schedule and ensure that it is followed well in order to complete the tasks or projects.
  - Competitive: Entrepreneurs become entrepreneurs because they know that they can handle the job or tasks better than others. The competitive spirit of the entrepreneurs has given birth to the number of companies that we see today.
- Functions of an Entrepreneur: The important functions of an entrepreneur are as follows:
  - Innovation: The basic and the foremost important function of an entrepreneur is innovation. They develop new ideas, technology, and products and create a new market. Innovation may include developing a new product or creating something different from the existing product.
  - Risk-taking: One of the biggest traits and features of entrepreneurs is that they are risk-takers. They are always willing to take risks and bear losses.
  - Research: Entrepreneurs are practical dreamers but they know how to turn their dreams into reality. They do a lot of ground work and research before taking leap in their ventures.







- Catalyst of Economic Development: An entrepreneur plays a vital role in accelerating the rate of economic development of a country by inventing new uses of available resources and maximising their utilisation.
- ▶ Role and Importance of an Entrepreneur
  - Bringing Economic Growth and Prosperity: Entrepreneurs bring economic growth and prosperity in the country by generating employment opportunities, creating capital and wealth, increasing per capita income and GDP (Gross Domestic Product), improving quality of life by raising the standard of living and providing economic independence to people.
  - Innovators of Economic Growth: Entrepreneurs play a very crucial role in the economic development of a nation by bringing new ideas, products, techniques, organisations and new markets.
  - Increase Productivity with Modern Production Systems: Entrepreneurs play an important role in increasing productivity by setting up modern production systems. They promote research and development and find new and innovative methods to increase productivity.
- ▶ Myths about Entrepreneurship: There are some myths about entrepreneurship which are as follows:

- Entrepreneurs are Born not Made: The biggest and the most common myth about entrepreneurship is that, entrepreneurship is an inborn skill and cannot be learned. But the truth is that it is a discipline comprising of processes, models and case studies.
- Only Money is Required to be an Entrepreneur: Finance is important for an enterprise to survive and grow but the most important things required are ideas and passion.
- To be an Entrepreneur, a Great Idea is the only Ingredient: A good or great idea will remain only an idea unless put into reality appropriately. A proper combination of all the resources including management is required to setup and run an enterprise.
