
Democracy and Diversity

Pooja was also not able to find a job until she came to our place.














But, people are not only discriminated on the basis of color of skin but on language, religion, class, gender, caste etc. Let me explain you.








You know what, Sushma! *When social differences are too acute this builds on social divisions.*



But these differences are not as clear as defined. There are overlapings and cross cuttings










Politics in social differences


These differences that exist in the society prove out to be advantageous for some, like the politicians.




The politicians should be very careful in taking steps regarding this.





















Case Study-Ireland
