Pooja was also not able to find a job until she came to our place.

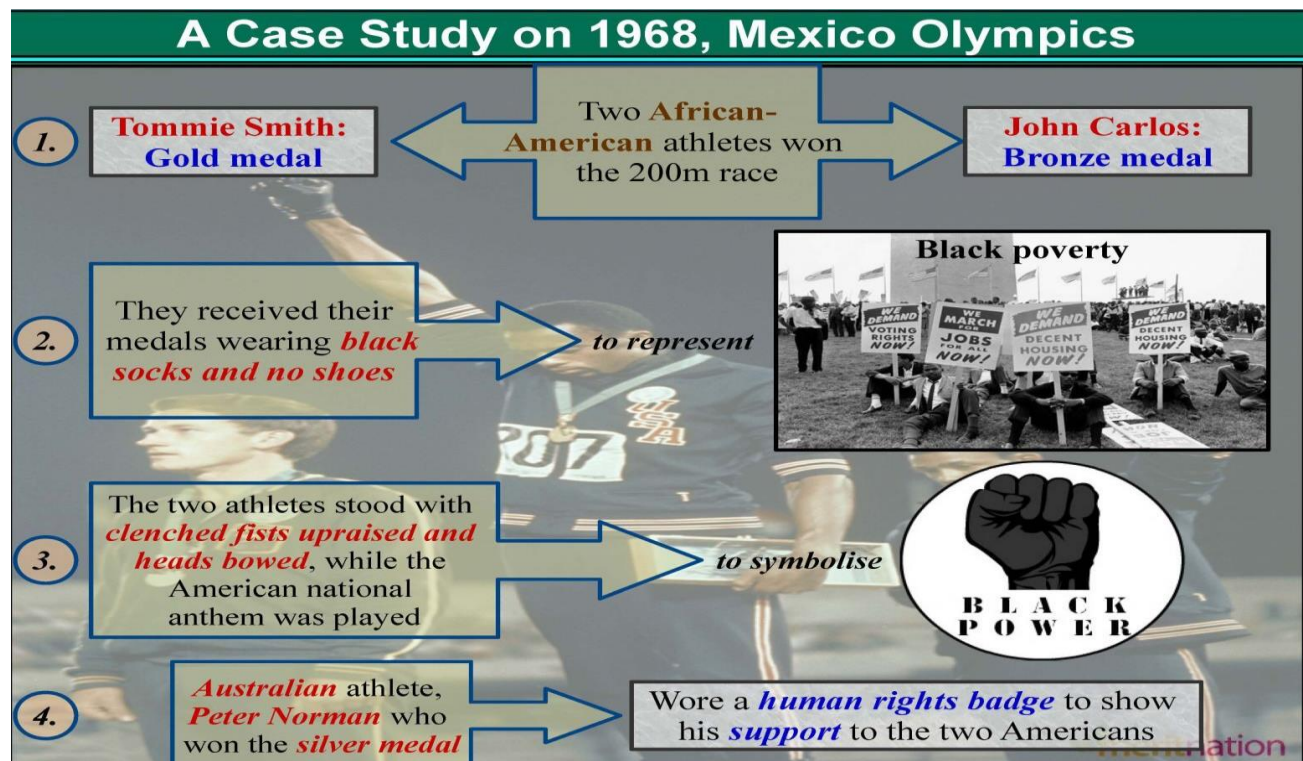

And all this is not that has started in recent times or is restricted only to India, but it is something that has been going from centuries together.

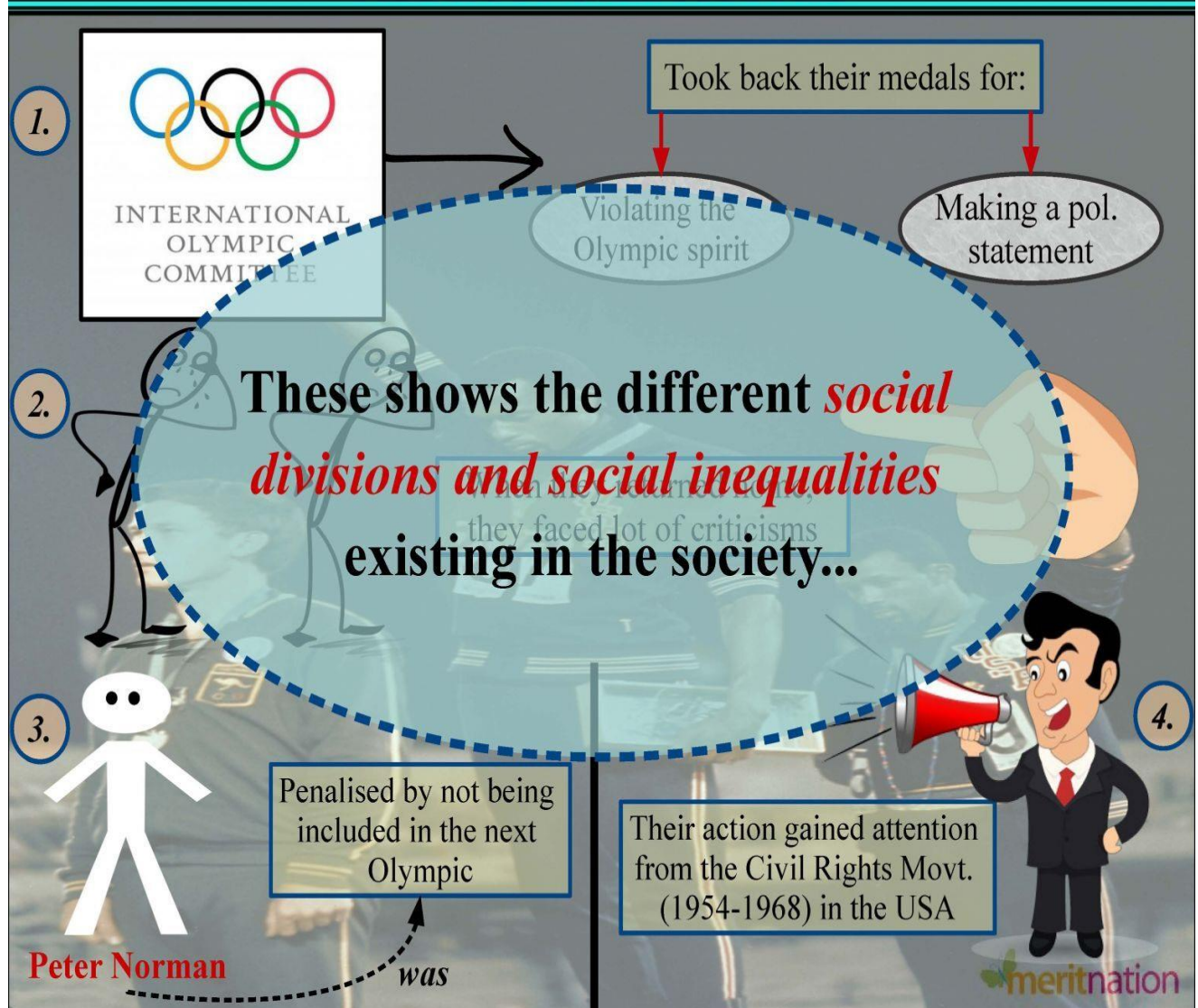

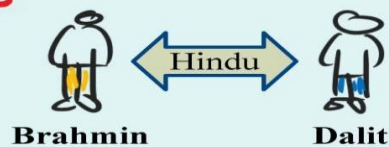


## Two Kinds of Social Differences



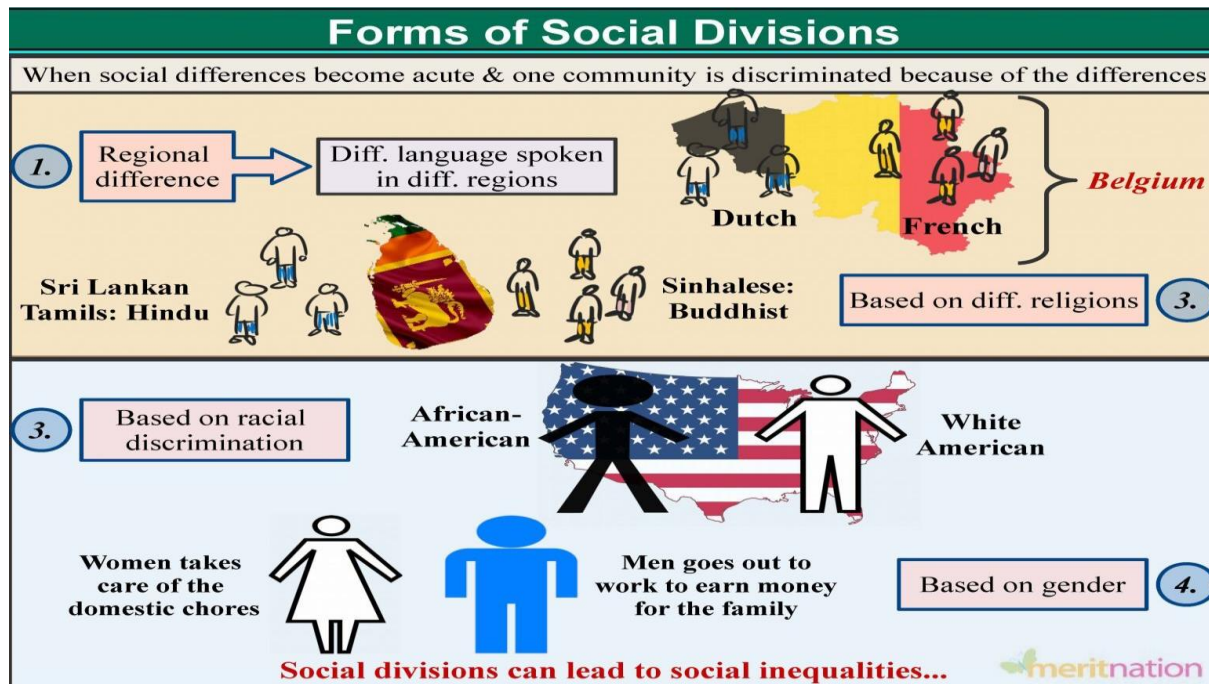
All **social differences** do not result in **social divisions**. Some can **unite** as well as **divide** people also...

**EXAMPLE**

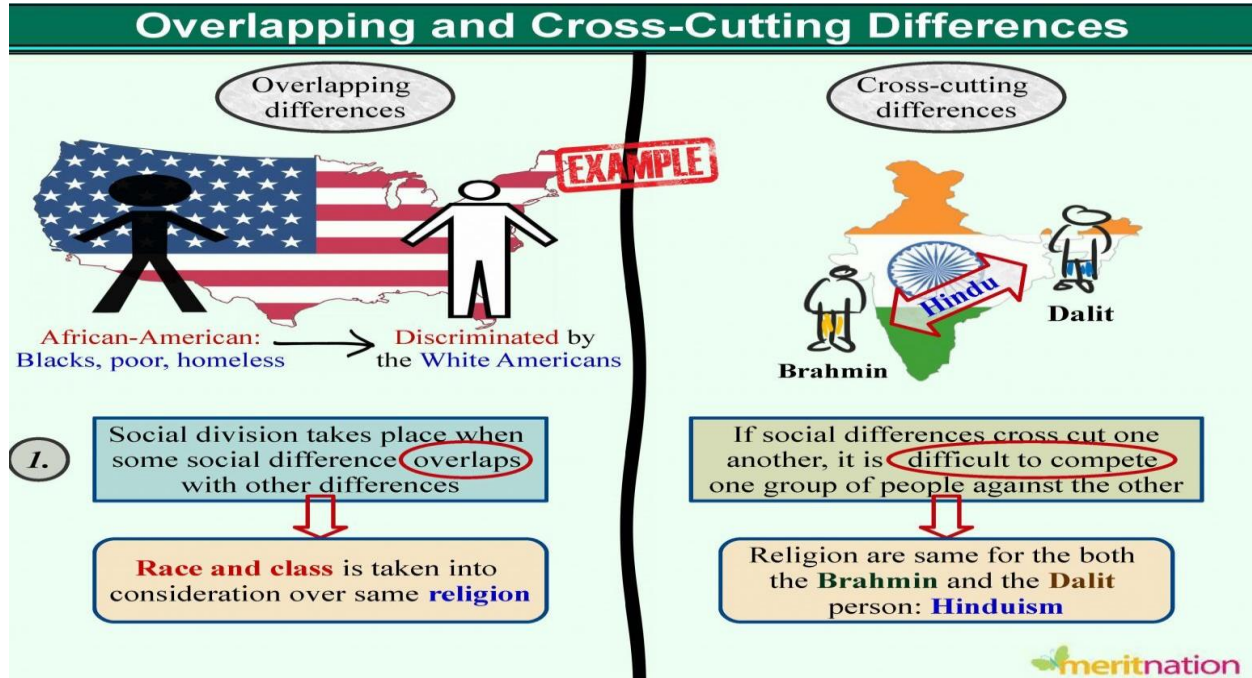


Group of people who interact with each other, share similar characteristics & a sense of unity...

You know what, Sushma! **When social differences are too acute this builds on social divisions.**

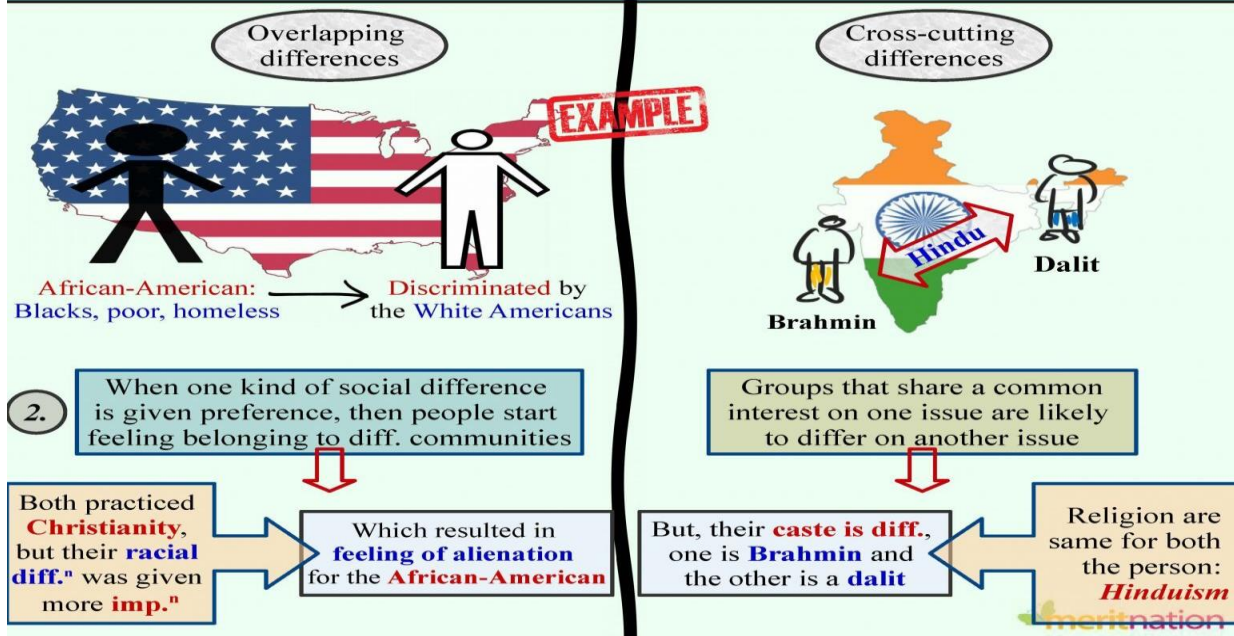

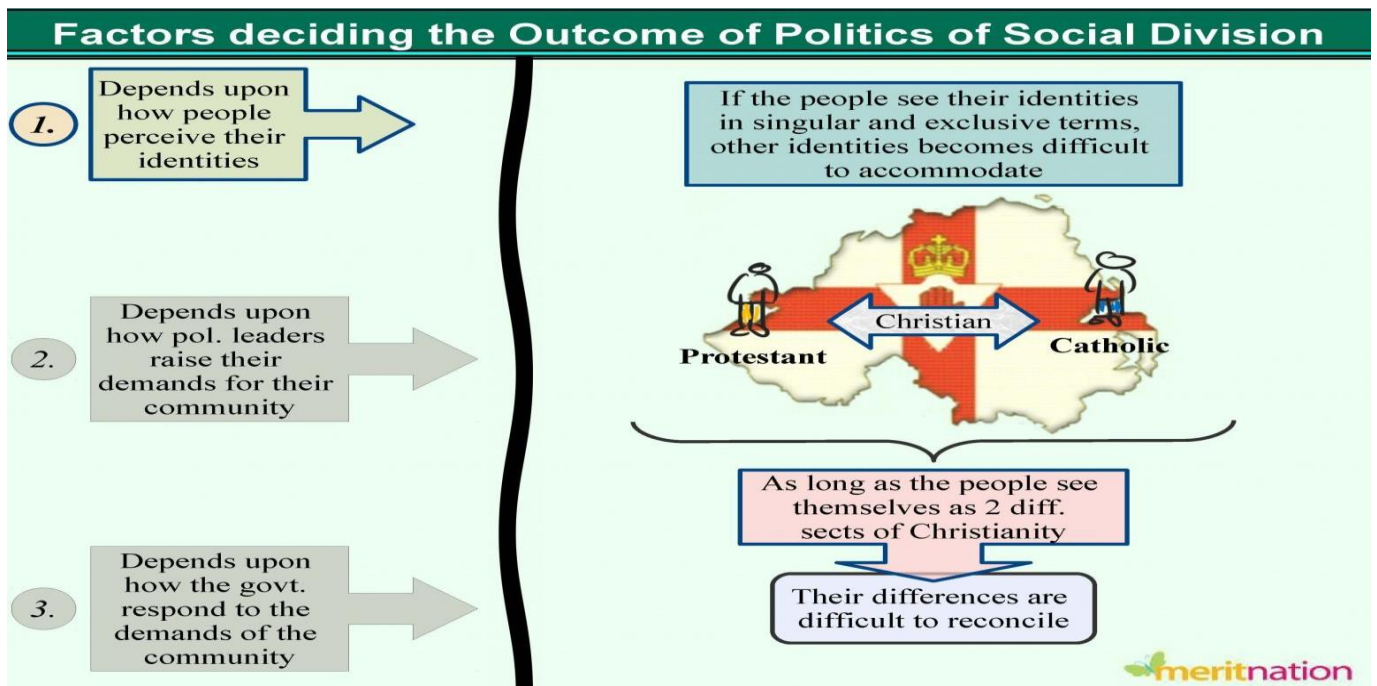


## Politics in social differences

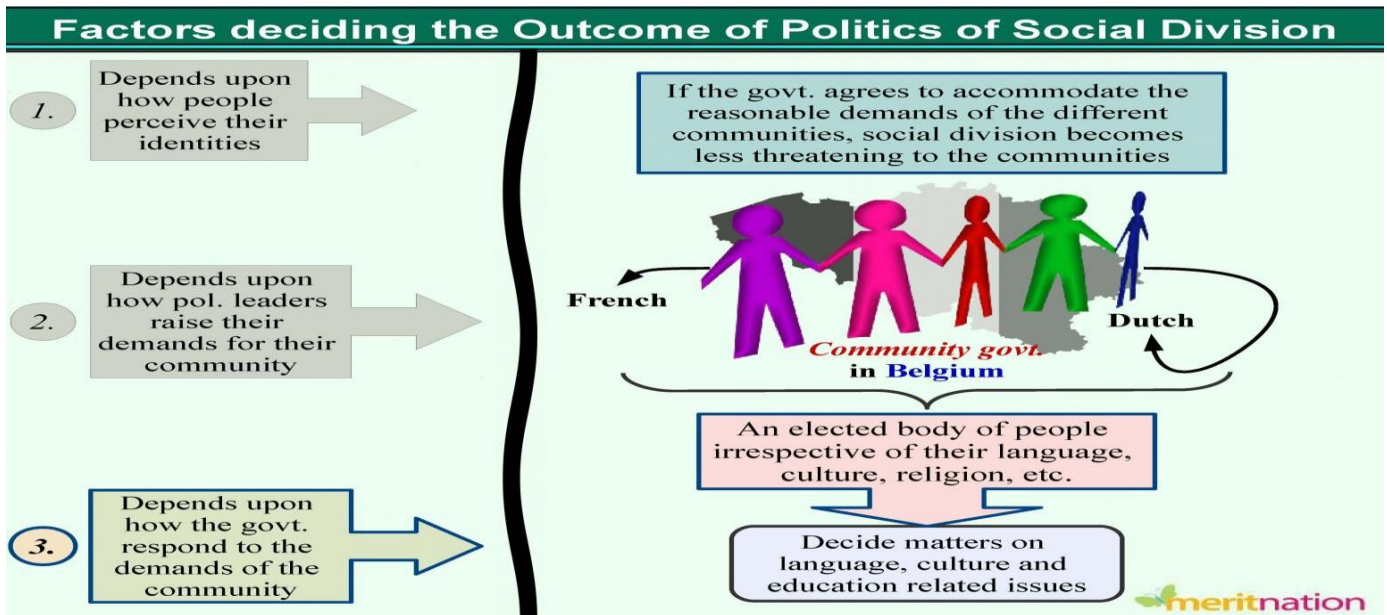
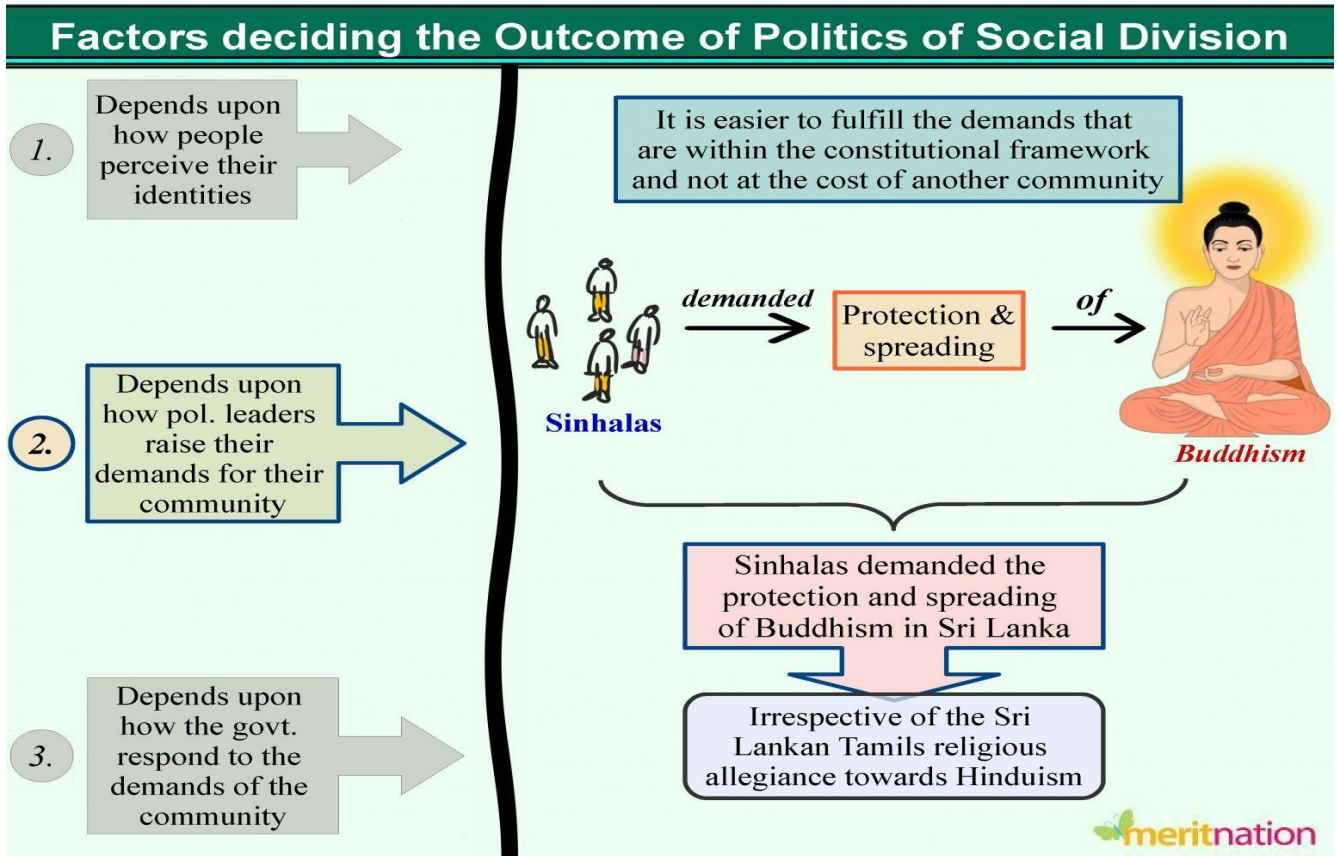
These differences that exist in the society prove out to be advantageous for some, like the politicians.

### Case Study- Ireland

Consider the cases of Northern Ireland. Here the population was dominated by the Christians but they were divided between Catholics and Protestants. In Northern Ireland, class and religion overlap with each other. If you are Catholic, you are also more likely to be poor, and you may have suffered a history of discrimination. - The results is that **Catholics and Protestants** have had conflicts in Northern Ireland

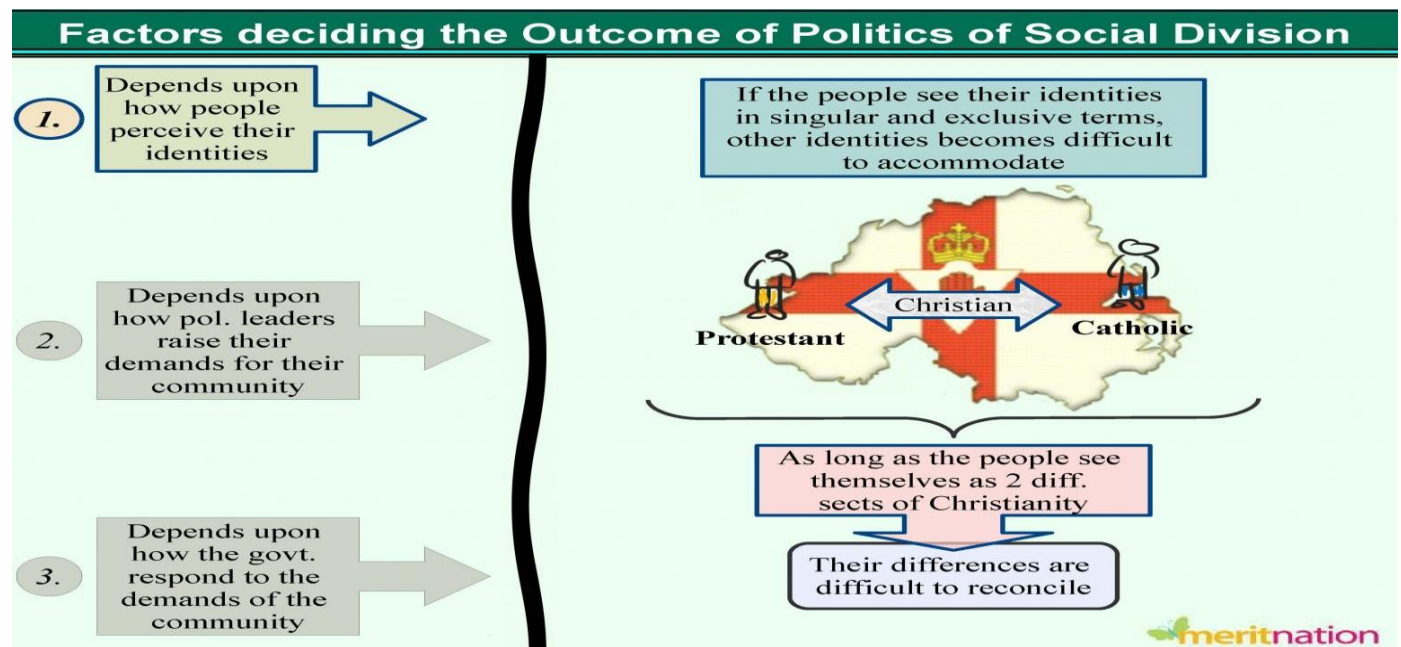


## Case Study- Yugoslavia

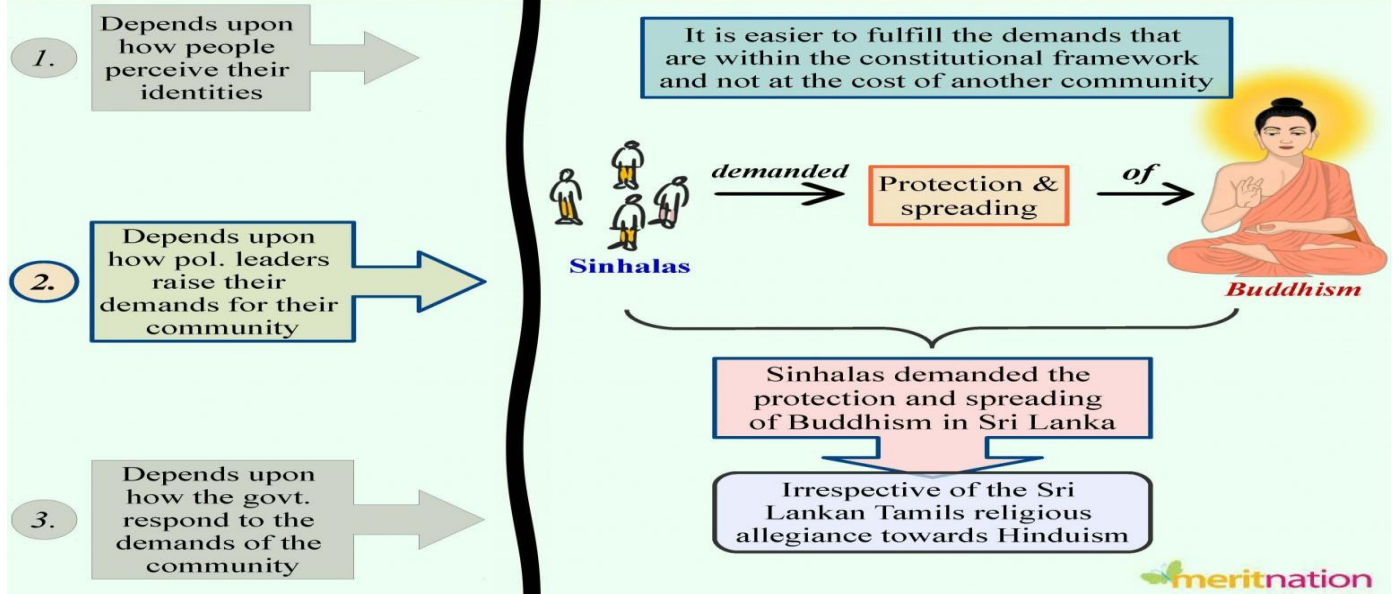
Yugoslavia, did not have a happy end. Political competition along religious and ethnic lines led to the disintegration of Yugoslavia into six independent countries.
