
3. Shravan Kumar



Shravan Kumar was an obedient (આશાંકિત) son, who lived with his elderly (વૃદ્ધ) parents. His parents were blind. One day, his parents expressed (વ્યક્ત કરી) their desire (ઇચ્છા) to go on a pilgrimage (યાત્રા). So, Shravan made a 'Kavad' with two large sturdy (મજબૂત) baskets and tied each basket on either side of a long bamboo stick. He made his parents sit in the 'Kavad' and caried them on his shoulders. He amied (તાક્યું) his arrow from where the sound was coming and released towards it. The arrow pierced (વિંધ્યું) straight into the chest of Shravan Kumar who was collecting water. Even in his last breath, Shravan asked king Dashrath to – quench the thirst of his parents and only then tell them about the tragedy (કરુણાંતિકા).
