



Chandrashekhar Azad was born on 23 July, 1906 in Bhavra, Madhya Pradesh. At a very young age he got involved in revolutionary activities. He joined the non cooperation movement. He was involved in incidents such as Kakori Train Robbery. assembly bomb incident and the shooting of Saunders at Lahore, to avenge the killing of Lala Lajpat Rai.

He was once caught by the British police and was sentenced to 15 whiplashes as his first punishment. At that time he was only 15 years old.

Disillusioned with Mahatma Gandhi's suspension of non-cooperation movement due to Chauri-Chaura incident, he turned

ENGLISH (Second Language into an extremist. On 27 February, 1931, betrayed by one of the associates, he was surrounded by the British police.
