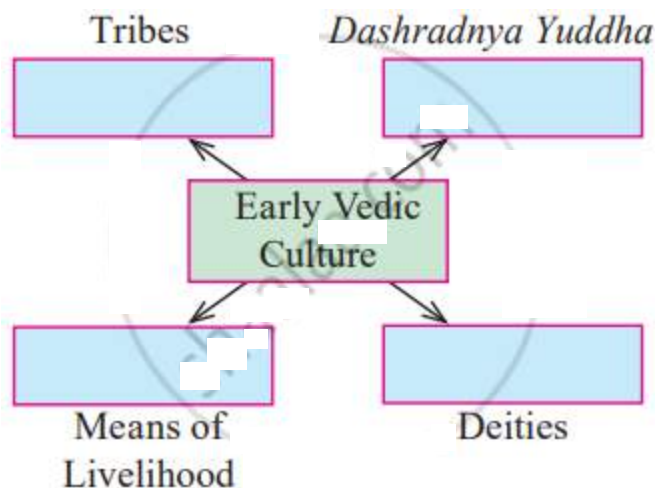

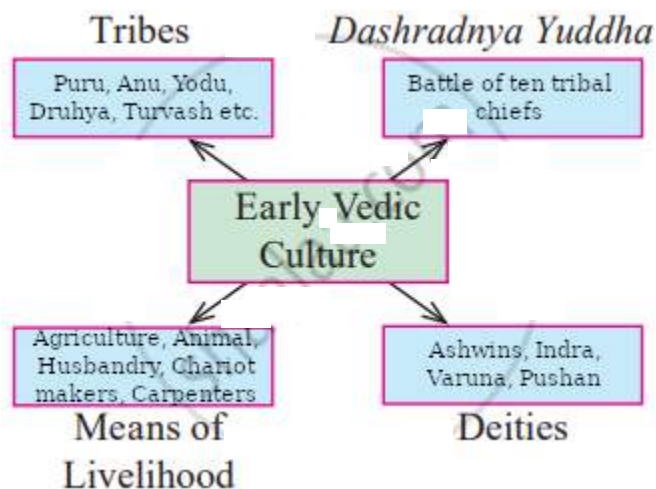

Origin of Aryan people

SOLUTION

1. There are multiple unanswered questions, such as, who were the Aryans, did they arrive in India from a distant place, or were they natives of India, which are the archaeological sites where the remains of their culture are found, how to identify those remains, etc.
2. Most of the information about their culture is derived from the Vedic literature. There are various opinions about the chronology of the Vedic culture.
3. However, there is a general agreement that the Vedic people composed Rigveda in India around 1500 B.C.E.
4. However, Lokmanya Tilak calculated this date as 6000 B.C.E. on the basis of astronomical events.



5. He was also of the opinion that the original home of the Aryans was in the Arctic region.

Indo-European family of languages

SOLUTION

1. In the year 1583, an Italian merchant by the name Fillippo Sassetti came to Kochi (Cochin) the port city in Kerala.
2. He never returned to his motherland. He stayed in Kerala and Goa. During his stay, he wrote detailed letters to his family members about Indian life, language, and culture. He happens to be the first European who wrote about his observations of the Indian society.
3. He also studied Sanskrit. He was the first one who observed the similarities between Sanskrit and Latin.
4. His observations could be said to be the first, to give impetus to the notion of a family of Indo-European languages.
